


During the memorial we also have a Memorial Day speech and Reading of 3 memorial day poems "In Flanders Field", "We shall keep the faith", and "We remember them".

The "Tomb of the Unknown Soldier" in Bremerton, Washington is one of the only dedicated Tomb of the Unknown Soldiers, outside of Arlington, Virginia. Ivy Green Cemetery has a large military section with all services represented. The Tomb of the Unknowns in Bremerton was placed in Ivy Green Cemetery in the 1960s. It is due to the many Unknowns that were buried in a mass grave off of the USS Saratoga. It was refurbished in 1992 and then modernized in 2012. Both of these renovations were done by volunteer groups at no cost to the city. Numerous ceremonies take place at the tomb including Memorial Day Remembrance in May and Wreaths Across America Ceremony in December. The USS Saratoga Memorial is beside it and now lists the 61 names of the Sailors of the USS Saratoga MIA/KIA and those buried in a mass grave at the cemetery.

May House and Club Projects



So we now have a new PCL 300 fire suppression tank for our kitchen with 3 newly installed hoses over our flat top and burners, a newly required WC-6L fire extinguisher for the kitchen, 3 new fire/CO2 detectors 2 upstairs and 1 downstairs, the stove hood has been cleaned and inspected and tagged, the fire suppression system has been inspected and tagged, all of our fire extinguisher upstairs and downstairs have been inspected and tagged, and the HVAC heating and cooling system have been Serviced and they are working on the repairs needed from that inspection to insure that the Post home has heat and air conditioning when we need it.

I want to thank Steve, Chuck G, and Daniel for helping get these tasks completed so quickly so we could get our insurance inspectors emails to stop.

We have a very active house and club chairman that puts many volunteer hours into repairs and building maintenance that not many people see and understand. Without Steve's hours of inspecting, investigating, preventive maintenance, and repairs, our building would have either fallen apart, burned down from electrical issues, or just been a run-down old building.

June 10 Cleaning headstones at Bonney Watson Memorial Cemetery




