Also, please encourage our youth to vote students who are 16 and older can register in advance, and will be notified when they turn 18 when they are eligible to vote in our state and national elections.

Finally, I would like to remind all of you that the VFW and its Auxiliary does not endorse or promote any candidates. Be mindful of that, if you go to any rallies for candidates that you do not wear any of your post or auxiliary identification. The Historian and Media Relations program is just that, we are keeping our history alive. You will always find some great pictures of things that are going on at our post and auxiliary in the newsletter. It is so easy now to record and share what is going on through email and social media.
